

Places to stay in Santiago (2016)

There are literally hundreds of hotels in Santiago in all price ranges. Here is just a sample of some of them:

For a taste of old Chile (somewhat seedy, but clean) you can try the **Foresta Hotel** for \$72 a double. It is spacious, right on Cerro Santa Lucia and near the newest restaurant and bar area, Lastarria, and has one of the best old time bars in Santiago (with a piano player most nights).

Or you can choose an apartment at the new **ApartHotel Providencia**, at \$74 for a two-bedroom apartment with a kitchen and sitting room (and less for a one bedroom), which is on a very quiet street just three blocks off of Providencia, a bustling shopping and restaurant area near Los Leones (and not too far from the old Peace Corps office).
